## Moulage Corner: Black Tarry Stools



### Ingredients

½ pkg. chocolate pudding mix  
1 drop each of green, blue and red food coloring  
Water  
Strawberry preserves, blended  
Artificial blood as needed

### Instructions

Mix half a packet of the pudding mix with green, blue and red food coloring. Do not use sugar-free pudding – the sugar is needed to form the lumps.

Add additional red food color and mix in water to desired consistency.

This should produce a black tarry stool. Add the desired amount of blended strawberry preserves with seeds to the bedpan, chux or diaper. Use more preserves and less stool if a bloody stool is desired.

## Manikin Mailbag

### Dear Manikin Mailbag:

I'm afraid to place an IV in the manikin's arm. These guys are sooooo expensive. I heard mold will grow in the veins if I don't clean and dry them good enough. Do you have any tips on how to make a functioning IV site in my million-dollar man?

### Dear Sally,

Yes, that is true! You do need to pay careful attention to the maintenance and cleaning of the IV arm veins. If not cleaned, disinfected, and dried appropriately, mold will grow. We have found a fairly simple, yet realistic approach to a functioning IV in a high-fidelity manikin as well as a standardized patient.

### Supplies Needed:

Empty liter IV bag  
Secondary IV tubing, preferably with clamps removed  
Coban tape  
IV extension set  
Female Luer Thread Style Coupler  
Safety pin

## Instructions:



Connect the female luer thread coupler to the end of the IV extension tubing in place of the IV catheter. Next, hook the other end of the female coupler to the secondary IV line. Attach an empty liter IV bag to the end of the secondary IV line to act as a drainage bag for any IV fluids that are administered. Tape the extension tubing on the arm as if it were actually inserted into the skin. Use a Tegaderm over the insertion site to allow for student assessments of the site.



Place Coban over the secondary IV line tubing to secure it. Run the secondary IV tubing behind the manikin or SP's arm with drainage bag hanging behind the head of the bed. Use a safety pin to hold in place. Empty bag as needed.

## SSH Accredits Simulation Centers

The SSH Council for Accreditation of Healthcare Simulation Programs accredited its first healthcare simulation program in 2010. There are now over 100 SSH Accredited Programs from 10 countries, and SSH is the largest healthcare simulation accrediting body in the world.

A Healthcare Simulation Program is eligible for SSH Accreditation when it is able to demonstrate compliance with the established core and area specific standards. A program must have a minimum of two years experience in the functional area in which accreditation is sought. Programs seeking SSH accreditation must demonstrate compliance in one or more of three areas of simulation/simulator use; Assessment, Research, or Teaching/Education. A Program may seek accreditation for its System Integration and Patient Safety only if they are applying for accreditation in one of the other 3 areas.

## SSH Provisional Simulation Center Accreditation

Minnesota State University's (MSU) Nursing Simulation Center received provisional accreditation by SSH. SSH provisional accreditation means MSU's nursing simulation center is accredited for two years. After that, the University will apply for full accreditation status.

MSU's 16,000-square-foot Maverick Family Simulation Center is located in the University's Clinical Sciences Building, which opened in January 2017. The simulation center provides access to 13 mannequins, ranging from newborns to adults, for both students and professionals.




## SSH Full Accreditation of Simulation Centers in Minnesota

Minnesota has two simulation centers that have full SSH accreditation. These two centers are among the approximately 100 centers worldwide that have achieved accreditation.

Children's Simulation Center and Mobile Simulation Lab in St. Paul, Minnesota is co-directed by Karen Mathias and Samreen Vora. SSH granted Children's Simulation Center accreditation in the areas of Teaching/Education and Systems Integration in 2015.



HealthPartners Clinical Simulation and Learning Center, in St. Paul, Minnesota, is directed by Krista Anderson. HealthPartners has been accredited since 2011. In 2016 HealthPartners Simulation Center was reaccredited in Teaching/Education, Assessment and Systems Integration.



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## Dr. Gail Libby Johnson: August 2, 1963 – July 11, 2018

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It is with deep sadness that we write to inform you know that Dr. Gail Johnson, a leader in simulation in Minnesota, member of our MnSHEP Advisory Team, and former Director of the HealthPartners Clinical Simulation Center passed away in her home, surrounded by family on Wednesday, July 11, 2018. Gail was diagnosed with metastatic ovarian cancer (stage 4) in March 2016.

Over her lifetime, Gail worked at HCMC, LifeSource, North Memorial and HealthPartners. Most recently she was the Director of the Simulation Center at HealthPartners which started in the basement of Metro State University in 2007 and later moved to its much larger location at Regions Hospital where she retired in December 2017, after running the simulation program for 10 years.

Gail was actively involved with the Society for Simulation in Healthcare (SSH), certified CHSE and CHSOS, and was instrumental in obtaining SSH Accreditation of HealthPartners Simulation Center in 2011. Gail will be greatly missed by all.


