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## Benefits of Accreditation

- ▶ Encourages examining and streamlining of processes.
- ▶ Provides a competitive edge in the community, program offerings, and grant funding.
- ▶ Fosters a feedback loop between education and practice by participating in a continuous process of improvement.
- ▶ Improves healthcare simulation through providing standardization and a pool of knowledge of best practices.

- ▶ Program Management

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## Accreditation Standards

- ▶ CORE +
  - ▶ Teaching/Education
  - ▶ Assessment
  - ▶ Research
- ▶ Systems Integration
  - ▶ Apply for only if one of the above specialties is applied for as well

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## Society for Simulation in Healthcare Accreditation

- ▶ Full accreditation
  - ▶ Five year Granted/Annual Review
  - ▶ Program must have a minimum of two years' experience in the functional area
  - ▶ Must demonstrate compliance with Core Standards and one or more of the three following areas of simulation in healthcare:
    - ▶ Teaching & Education
    - ▶ Assessment
    - ▶ Research
    - ▶ Systems Integration (only if one of the above three is included on the application)
  - ▶ Onsite One Day Review
  - ▶ \$5975 for Core + 1 (plus reviewers travel expenses)
    - ▶ Additional cost for additional accreditation areas



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## Society for Simulation in Healthcare Accreditation

- ▶ Provisional accreditation
  - ▶ Programs with established structure and processes, but have not yet achieved outcomes for full accreditation
  - ▶ Program must be in operation for a minimum of two years
  - ▶ Granted for two years, may renew for two additional years or go for full accreditation/Annual review
  - ▶ Must demonstrate compliance with Core Standards and Teaching/Education Standards
  - ▶ Electronic/Telephone Review
  - ▶ \$2495 (Core + Teaching/Education)



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## Navigating the Process

- ▶ Gaining support
  - ▶ Budget/funding for Accreditation
    - ▶ Academic
      - ▶ Nursing program: Provost supports Accreditation
        - ▶ Ask: "Why would supporting simulation-based education for replacing clinical time not be?"
    - ▶ Health Organization/Professional Practice
      - ▶ Joint Commission
      - ▶ CMS: Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services
      - ▶ MDH: Minnesota Department of Health
  - ▶ Stakeholder/Faculty Buy-In

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## Navigating the Process

- ▶ How to Prepare
  - ▶ Application Completion \$100 Fee
  - ▶ Letter of commitment from administration
  - ▶ Companion Documents
  - ▶ Self-Study

| Core Standards and Criteria   |   |

| Core Standards are fundamental structural and operational standards that all accredited Programs must meet. The 7 sections of Core Standards are: (1) Mission & Governance, (2) Program Management, (3) Resource Management, (4) Human Resources, (5) Program Improvement, (6) Ethics, and (7) Expanding the Field. |   |
| <b>I. MISSION AND GOVERNANCE</b>  |   |
| <i>a. The Simulation Program has a clear and publicly stated mission and/or vision statement(s) that specifically addresses the intent and functions of the Program.</i>  |   |
| i.  | Provide a copy of the Program's mission and/or vision statement(s)  |
| <i>b. The Simulation Program has an appropriate organizational structure.</i>   |   |
| i.  | Describe Program's organization and structure including how it is linked to the larger organization, if one exists.   |
| ii.   | Provide organizational chart(s) that demonstrate the Program's organization and structure including lines of authority within the Program.  |
| iii.  | If the Program is a part of the larger organization, provide the organizational chart(s) that demonstrate the Program's position within the organization including lines of authority within the larger organization. |
| <i>c. The Simulation Program has a process for strategic review and approval of its activities.</i>   |   |
| i.  | Describe the governance structure including people or committees that provide oversight and/or advisory functions to the Program.   |

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## Navigating the Process

- ▶ "AH-HA" Moments
  - ▶ Time
  - ▶ The importance of policies and procedures that guide the program
  - ▶ Complexity of standardizing policies and procedures
  - ▶ Proof of evidence
  
- ▶ Solutions
  - ▶ Dividing & Conquering
  - ▶ *The Right People* doing the *Right Work*

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## Navigating the Process: Provisional

- ▶ What to expect
  - ▶ Review process is over the phone
  - ▶ Reviewers take time to review before setting up a phone call to discuss
  - ▶ Questions are posed on the phone call to the program
  - ▶ Program chooses who should be in the room for the review call
  - ▶ Helpful tips given by the reviewers
  - ▶ Reviewer recommendations (7-10 days; final decision, approx. 1 month)

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## Results

- ▶ Suggestions from reviewers
  - ▶ Program has 10 days to respond to comments
- ▶ Lead reviewer presents findings to the SSH Accrediting Board of Review
  - ▶ Final decision in approximately one to three months
  - ▶ Program can appeal

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## Afterwards

- ▶ Do not become complacent
- ▶ Ensure the practices created are continued
- ▶ Keep good records on an ongoing basis
- ▶ Annual reviews required
